Conn Artists Theatre Company – an introduction

We are the professional theatre company associated with the Connaught Theatre in Worthing having been supported by Worthing Theatres since 2013.

We create live theatre that engages audiences; sharing great stories that resonate with timeless, universal themes about the human condition which are socially relevant; often a reimagining or adaptation of a classic or neglected work.

Recently we produced a successful revival of *The Haunting* by Hugh Janes which played 53 performances and toured to 41 regional theatres from Autumn 2023 to Spring 2024.

From 2021-2023, we toured the UK Premiere of *A Perfect Likeness* by Daniel Rover Singer (founder of the Reduced Shakespeare Company); a new play about an imagined and revealing encounter between two of the 19th Century's most iconic English authors, Charles Dickens and Lewis Carroll which delighted all audiences who saw it.

In 2022, we toured a revival of J.M. Barrie's ghost play *Mary Rose*, described by a 5 star review from Theatre South East as "*Hauntingly beautiful*". In 2019, we mounted a regional tour of George Eliot's *Silas Marner* adapted by Geoffrey Beevers. Supported by Arts Council England and The George Eliot Fellowship in the writer's bicentenary year the production was highly praised as the company's best work to date and gained 5 star and 4 star reviews from The Argus, Remote Goat and The Stage. Integral to this tour was the engagement with GCSE students, homeless people and refugees through workshops and outreach sessions.

In 2017 we mounted our first tour and landmark production of Hilaire Belloc's book *The Four Men* adapted by Sussex playwright Ann Feloy and directed by former Artistic Director of the Connaught Theatre, Nick Young. Supported by and working in partnership with the South Downs National Park Authority and Worthing Museum, the show was a huge hit with regional audiences.



Conn Artists present a new stage adaptation of "Far from the Madding Crowd" for a National UK Tour in spring 2025

Conn Artists Theatre Company revives Thomas Hardy's classic novel *Far from the Madding Crowd*, adapted by Nick Young & Ross Muir, for a nationwide theatre tour starting February 2025 and will visit (VENUE NAME) on (DATE).

This adaptation brings to life the story of Bathsheba Everdene, a headstrong woman managing her inherited farm in Victorian England, as she navigates romantic entanglements with three very different suitors: the steadfast shepherd Gabriel Oak, the charming but reckless Sergeant Troy, and the wealthy landowner Mr. Boldwood.

Touring to over 40 venues, this production captures Hardy's themes of independence, class, love and marriage. The play features a cast of five actors with live period music and ballads, ensemble storytelling, embodying the spirit of rural Victorian England.

Actor and Producer, Ross Muir, says "Far from the Madding Crowd is an exciting return to previous literary stage adaptations that we have produced in the past, like George Eliot's Silas Marner and Hilaire Belloc's The Four Men, which I feel are the heart and soul of Conn Artists live theatre work. Our adaptation will be fast moving and inventive with interlinking folk songs. Far from the Madding Crowd will appeal not only to fans of Thomas Hardy but to anyone who simply wants to come to the theatre and enjoy a gripping romantic story."

Director, Nick Young says, "A great novel, great characters and lots of dramatic action. Bringing these all to life is what theatre does best. The heroine is, in many ways, a very contemporary woman. Strong, independent, attractive but flawed by her vanity. Tragedy, comedy and passion walk hand in hand in this unforgettable piece of drama, performed in Conn Artists unique style"

The Production Team & Cast



NICK YOUNG – Adapter & Director

Nick got the directing bug when he used to invite another 5-year-old from school to come and watch his puppet shows, staged in an old empty wireless. He launched his first company, Rafter Players, modestly, with a production of *Hamlet*, staged in a Victorian attic. Over the next ten years the company grew, touring its productions throughout Scandinavia and Russia – as well as Brixton!

At Oxford he read English (very occasionally) and directed numerous shows, including the famous Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor *Dr Faustus*, when he was the student director to Professor Nevill Coghill. He joined the RSC as a trainee director and worked with actors such as Dame Helen Mirren and Patrick Stewart.

For three years he was the director of the world-famous Ludlow Festival, staging epic Shakespeare in the Castle. For ten years he was the Artistic Director of the Connaught Theatre, Worthing where he had enormous fun creating ensemble companies and directing musicals, premieres, classics, thrillers and farces.

He formed Rainbow Theatre in 1983 to inspire children with drama, and writing and directing its repertoire. Over the past twenty years Rainbow Shakespeare, the company that he formed with his wife Alex, has been creating exciting Shakespeare for family audiences in Worthing, London and France.

Nick has directed several productions for Conn Artists, and is excited to be working on their new adaptation of *Far from the Madding Crowd*, which opens at Theatre Royal Winchester.



ROSS MUIR – Adapter, Producer and as William Boldwood

Ross trained at Guildford School of Acting and graduated with a BA First Class Honours in Theatre.

London appearances as an actor include the Almeida Theatre, Arts Theatre and New Players Theatre. National tours in the UK and Germany include *Figaro-the play, Black Comedy, The Real Inspector Hound* and *The Caretaker*.

Ross became a major performer with Rainbow Theatre in schools where he first met Nick; and went onto play Hamlet, Leontes in *The Winter's Tale*, Oberon in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Benedick in *Much Ado About Nothing*, Petruchio in *The Taming of the Shrew*, among many leading roles with Rainbow Shakespeare over the past 20 years.

Ross co-founded Conn Artists in 2013 and has produced all of their shows to date. As an actor for the company, he enjoyed playing the title role in *Silas Marner* in 2019, and Hilaire Belloc in *The Four Men* in 2017. He also starred as Lewis Carroll opposite David Stephens as Charles Dickens in the acclaimed UK Premiere of Daniel Rover Singer's play *A Perfect Likeness* which toured 2021 – 2023.

Recently he played David Filde in the company's UK tour of *The Haunting* 2023 – 2024
